A READING FROM PAUL'S LETTER TO THE PHILIPPIANS

Pastor Laura (Philippians 4:12-13)

I know what it is to have little, and I know what it is to have plenty.

In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being well-fed and of going hungry, of having plenty and of being in need.

I can do all things through Christ, who gives me strength.

MESSAGE

Pastor Rachael

Many of our youth have chosen this reading from Philippians this year, and over the years, as a verse that inspires them in their faith, a verse to carry with them in their lives: I can do all things through Christ, who gives me strength.

A few weeks ago as we met to begin our final preparations for today, we talked a little bit about how helpful it can be to have a verse from the Bible that we have not just memorized, but internalized and can draw upon for strength, motivation, and inspiration. And we also talked a little bit about how it's important to know more about the verse we choose than just how it makes us personally feel: who wrote it? Why did they write it? How does it fit into the bigger paragraph, story, or book of the Bible where it's found? What did it mean for the people it was first written about, for, or to? And how does that relate to what it means for us? When we do this, we sometimes find out that a verse we thought sounded just right on its own doesn't really mean the same thing in context that we were using it to mean when we plucked it out to stencil on the wall or make into a bumper sticker!

Other times, though, we discover that a verse only becomes more inspiring when we learn about its context and how it fits into the whole of Scripture. So today, we are looking a little closer at this verse from Philippians, and the one before it. As it turns out, I think it will hold up as a pretty perfect reading for a Confirmation class coming to profess their faith in the cold, outdoors, in masks, during a pandemic.

Our reading from Philippians is at the end of a letter Paul wrote to this faith community, arguably one of his favorites among all the churches he started! He has written them this brief letter, likely we have here just one small piece of the history of their letters back and forth to one another. Paul is not there with them in Philippi - he has been off on many journeys, including being thrown in prison because of his preaching and organizing for Jesus. In his absence the church has been tended by local religious leaders. But the Christians in Philippi have not had it easy. They have faced challenges, opposition to their faith, and it appears based on what Paul shares with them in this letter that they were also struggling within their own faith community because of disagreements.

Paul writes this letter reminding them that no matter what happens to them or even what disagreements arise among them, the most important thing is for them to behave like followers of Jesus! And this is a great letter because in several places Paul gets right to the point and tells them exactly what that means - he describes with simple lists what he expects followers of Jesus to do when they are stressed out, overwhelmed, frustrated, exhausted, annoyed with one another, locked in disagreement, fearful about the future. Things like this:

Whatever happens, live your life in a way that honors Christ.

Don't do things for selfish reasons, think of other people above yourself, watch out for each other. Don't spend your time complaining and arguing.

Remember that we are all at different places in our faith journeys, so focus on being where you are in yours with integrity and not on judging other people for being in a different place.

Rejoice in God! Be gentle in the way you treat people. Bring your worries to God.

Focus on what is good and just and holy.

And then, as he wraps up the letter, he shares closing thoughts with the Philippians based on his own experiences. Paul has been beaten up, thrown in prison, dragged to court. He has been cast out of communities, abandoned by former friends. His faith has cost him a lot. Still, when he sits down to write this letter he is not focusing on what he has lost so much as what he has gained. He has survived and been convinced that God is real in the hardest of hard times. He has had times in his life when everything was great and he had status and wealth and popularity. And he has also had times of being hated, mocked, and not having a nickel for bread. And what he has learned is that happiness, fulfillment, and a sense of integrity are not tied to any of those circumstances. Instead, he's figured out that no matter what the outside circumstances are, he has a source of satisfaction and joy: Jesus.

We are going through some things right now, aren't we? Really. All the things. We are going through all the things. A pandemic that has completely turned our lives inside out - we can't go to school the way we are used to, our work lives are unpredictable and always changing, we are having church in a parking lot in the cold. Every time we see our friends, if we get to see them at all, we know we are taking risks. A lot of people have gotten sick and then better, and a lot of people have gotten sick and died.

Our country is in an election process that has not brought out the best in us. Arguing and tensions are high. Frustration is at its peak.

Our attention has been drawn to injustices in our communities, especially those experienced by black, indigenous, and people of color. We struggle with how uncomfortable it is to become more aware of racism and marginalization in the places we call home and work and school and church.

All the things.

And yet - here you are. Here we are together.

Because, even if we grumble along the way,

even if we haven't been as gracious or patient or loving with each other as we aspire to be,

even if we have been frustrated by too many things changing all at once,

even if we have felt abandoned or picked on or misunderstood,

even if we have wanted more from our leaders,

even if we have wanted more from ourselves, even if ALL THE THINGS:

We can do ALL THE THINGS.

We can worship in a parking lot. We can proclaim our faith in the cold fall air.

We can offer grace to one another, recognizing that we are doing the best we can.

We can be grateful for all that we do have.

We can choose to lift one another up instead of tearing one another down.

We can do ALL THE THINGS.

But not because we are strong enough on our own,

or gracious enough, or pleasant enough, or good enough.

We're not. Left to our own devices, we're stressed, annoyed, angry, sad, lonely, frustrated, uncertain, complaining, unkind.

So it's a very good thing that we are not alone.

We are not left to our own devices. We are left to the grace and mercy, forgiveness and love of God in Jesus Christ. We are left to the power and presence of the Holy Spirit. We are left to one another.

We can do ALL THE THINGS through Christ who gives us strength. Thank God. Amen.

CONFIRMATION
